Hello, my name is Selina. I was born in Leamington and have lived here all my life. I'm married to Tim, and between us, we have a big family. I've worked in the NHS for over 30 years. When I was at primary school, a girl invited me and my brothers to her Sunday school.

Soon the whole family was going! From there I went to Tuesday Club for teenagers we heard about Jesus, but we also had lots of fun, playing games, going swimming, and even weekends away. I made some great friends and happy memories. When I was 16, we went on a church camp to the Isle of Wight. I loved the holiday and the people, but I still didn't want to be a Christian, Back home I felt unsettled. I told one of the leaders that I couldn't believe God really cared about me personally. They asked me a few questions: "If you ask for bread, would you be given a

stone?" I said, "No."
"If you ask for an egg, would
you be given a scorpion?" I
said, "No."

"If you ask God for the Holy Spirit, would He not give Him to you?" My answer was "Yes." In that moment I felt warmth. peace, and a real sense of God's love filling me. I knew without doubt that the Holy Spirit had come into my life. St Margaret's isn't the closest church to where I live, but it's where I feel at home. I've made a commitment to be part of it. I know I have many faults, yet lesus still loves and cares for me – and I believe He cares for you too.



It's been a busy and joy-filled few months at Connect@4pm! Together we've been exploring Creation, Baptism, and Bread in the Bible, as well as our way through Philippians – a letter written to the early church around 6oAD.

We also had the privilege of baptising two of our young
